About the diagram... I probably have too narrow of a view of what a "process" diagram is supposed to be. If it's a process or decision diagram, then I think most of us are used to having those go down the page or to the right. Right now it looks to me like it's more of a program structure with sort of a pyramid shape. I think it can work this way but I have a few comments:

- At the Agency Management Final Review/Approval stage, I would not expect my upper management to be making revisions because I would be updating them to get their feedback earlier. I think that feedback loop might be better at the Individual State Agency Stakeholder Review, which I would expect mid-level management (and upper if they have time) to participate in and give buy off before going to final approval.
- I would also guess that the Willamette Partnership would be facilitating discussions with the different groups, which isn't well illustrated. Perhaps WP could be in its own diagram to the left with a discussion short overview of what they do for each level rather than just at the bottom? Just food for thought...
